

# JANOME

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## Reverse Bobbinwork Embroidered Valentine

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**Level:** Beginner - Intermediate

Send your Valentine a card with reverse bobbin work created on your Memory Craft machine. This technique gives this Valentine Card extra texture and a unique look. Follow the below instructions to create your own! Note, knowledge of DigitizerPro is helpful to complete this project.

### Janome Supplies Required:

- Memory Craft 11000, 10001, 10000, 9700, 9500, 350E or 300E (embroidery only)
- DigitizerPro
- ATA PC Card, USB Memory Key or transfer cable
- Standard Hoop A or Hoop ST
- Embroidery Foot P
- Janome Cutaway stabilizer
- Blue Tip needle 75/11

### Fabric and Notions Required

- Card stock
- 6" x 6" Handmade papers
- Robison-Anton Decorative Floss thread - desired color
- Robison-Anton Embroidery thread - to match Decorative Floss
- Temporary spray adhesive
- Glue stick
- Scraps of ribbon, lace beads and buttons



**Digitizer 10000**

1. Download the Chenille Heart file from Design Downloads by clicking on this link with your RIGHT mouse button. Choose "Save Target As" and save to your favorite folder. Then change file extension from .jpe to .jpg.
2. Open DigitizerPro EasyDesign.
3. Import the Chenille Heart.
4. Click on the Run Line icon.
5. Beginning at the bottom of the heart, use right clicks to create one continuous curving line to fill in the heart shape. Press Enter on your keyboard to finish.
6. Click on the Select icon. Click on Object Details icon. Click on Line Stitch. Change to Triple Run. Click OK.
7. Save the design in your favorite folder in the \*.jef format or to an ATA PC card.
8. Print a template with crosshairs for use of this design in other projects.
9. Transfer the design to the Memory Craft using direct connection or an ATA PC Card.

**Reverse Bobbin Work Chenille**

1. Open the design in the Memory Craft.
2. Using the bobbin winder, wind a bobbin with Robison-Anton Polyester Floss.
3. Place the bobbin in the bobbin holder, by passing the tension spring.
4. Insert a Blue Tip needle.
5. Place matching embroidery thread in the needle.
6. Set the sewing speed at 400spm.
7. Place a layer of cut-away stabilizer in the A Hoop.
8. Spray the backside of the paper to be embroidered with the temporary spray adhesive. Adhere the paper to the bottom of the hoop.
9. Attach the hoop to the Memory Craft. You will be looking at the stabilizer; the paper will not be visible.
10. Start sewing. Note: This project must be monitored at all times. Do not walk away from the machine.
11. When the embroidery is completed remove the stabilizer from the hoop and trim it close to the stitching.

**Final Construction**

1. Tear the embroidered paper to the desired size.
2. Use a glue stick to adhere the paper to the cardstock and customize with ribbon, lace, buttons and beads.
3. Add your message on the inside with stamps or calligraphy pens.
